Tour Itinerary

Sunday 26th July 2026

Our ferry departs Heysham mid-afternoon. Upon arrival into the island's capital of Douglas, we take a short drive to Ramsey and our lovely 3* hotel. Free time to freshen up before we meet for our first group meal this evening. (D)

Monday 27th July 2026 - Tynwald to Peel

We start our walk with a visit to St John's Church and Tynwald Hill, where we find out about their significance in the governance of the island. The walk takes a rising traverse around the southern flank of Slieau Whallian, through pleasant pastureland down to the pretty village of Glen Maye. Its beautiful sheltered, fern-filled woodland include some relics of the ancient forests that once covered the island. The walk along the cliffs is followed by a spectacular descent into Peel, where we end our walk. Here we should have time to explore the castle and parts of the town, as well as taking the opportunity to buy some of the famous Manx kippers as an edible souvenir of your holiday. 9 miles (14.5km) (B, D)

Tuesday 28th July 2026 - Castletown

We take the steam train to Castletown the ancient capital of Mann, to join our gentle coastal walk with lovely views. The birdlife is abundant along this stretch of the Manx coastline and out to the Langness Peninsular, so a chance to spot various varieties of sea bird and the possibility of seeing basking sharks, dolphins or seals playing in the bay. 5 miles (8km) We will take lunch back in Castletown (at own expense) and have time to explore, before returning to our hotel by coach. (B, D)

Wednesday 29th July 2026 - Day at Leisure or Optional Excursion

Have a day to explore the island on the train, trams or buses, and perhaps include Snaefell mountain or join our optional excursion to the famous Laxey Wheel- at additional expense. It is the largest surviving original working waterwheel in the world. Full details and chance to book to be advised closer to departure. (B,D)

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Itinerary Continued...

Thursday 30th July 2026 - Port St. Mary to Port Erin

From the inner harbour in Port St Mary walk past the outer harbour until you get to Kallow Point. If the tide allows, have a look at the fossilised tree stumps here and then visit the memorial to WW2 sailors on the Mona's Queen. A gentle rise takes you to Perwick Bay, through Fistard village and then onto tracks across the open fields. Take your time as you head near the cliff edge to see the rock stack known as the Sugarloaf: a nesting site for kittiwakes, guillemots and razorbills, as we go via the Chasms. We should be rewarded with spectacular views over the Calf of Man. Turning inland to Cregneash, we leave the coastal path and head northwards to Port Erin Bay and the village itself. On a clear day look out to sea for the Mountains of Mourne. Finish in Port Erin. 5miles (8km)

Friday 31st July 2026 - Ramsay - Maughold

The walk today takes us from a bustling harbour town to the peaceful coastal cliffs of Maughold Brooghs. We leave Ramsay to follow over the electric railway line to reach Port Lewaigue and Gob ny Rona. Take time to look back at the sweep of Ramsay Bay. Soak up the spectacular scenery before arriving on the edge of the village of Maughold where we'll find the church and shelter which houses the largest collection of carved Norse and Celtic crosses. We return to Ramsay by coach with time to explore and take some refreshments, before heading back to our hotel. 4miles (6.5km) (B,D)

Saturday 1st August 2026

After an early start we arrive in Douglas for our ferry back to the mainland. For those travelling to Staffordshire, we visit the historic city of Lancaster for a lunch (at own expense) before returning home late afternoon. (B)

Ramsey Park, Ramsey

Enjoy fabulous views over Mooragh Lake from our lovely hotel.

The Lake View Restaurant serves bistro-style lunches and dinners, with snacks available in the Piano Bar. Meals feature homemade, simple, seasonal food using fresh, local Manx produce, freshly prepared in their kitchen. On warm days, make the most of the Terrace with stunning lake views.

The Lake View Restaurant features home-made local food. Relax in the lovely Piano Bar or sit on the outside terrace with stunning Lake View

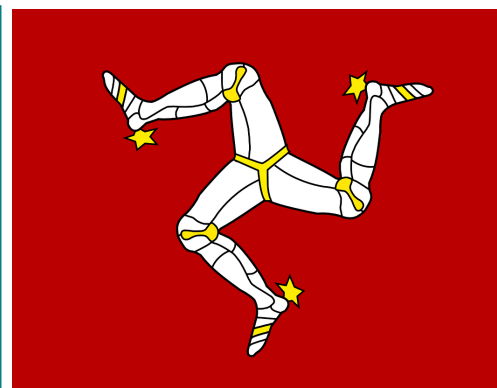
Regent Walking & Mobility:

Guided walks on this tour consist of 3 to 6 hours of easy to moderate walking over varied and undulating terrain with some easier sections. Although the pathways are easily navigable, some trails will be more strenuous, and challenging and are in a mountain environment. We will however make regular rest stops, to enjoy the scenery.

Walking distances range between 6kms and 15kms per day. This tour is suitable for people with a good level of fitness and stamina.

All walks will be escorted by a Regent Tour Manager and an expert local guide. Our local guide will give information on all points of interest during the walking programme.

All special requests such as health and dietary requirements must be given at time of booking and are not guaranteed. Our walking tours are not suitable for those with walking difficulties, and Regent must be informed if health declines over the booking period.
